DIGGING DEEPER

1. What acts of “heroism” seem to impress people today? What do we learn about true valor from Isaiah 9:6 and the meaning of El Gibbor, translated Mighty God?
2. Christ, our Mighty God, has handled the greatest crisis of our existence. What is that crisis? And what does the true knowledge of His accomplishment prompt from His people? Think on Romans 5:6-11 for continued reflection on the truths expressed in Sunday’s message.
3. Christ, our Mighty God, is able to handle the deepest anxieties we carry. Do you truly believe this? Reflect on Isaiah 35 with a focus on verses 3-4. What is God saying to your heart? How does this help you?
4. Isaiah 9:3-5 speaks of the “yoke” of the oppressor. What does the Messiah do with that yoke according to verses 4? But will he replace it with another (see Matthew 11:28-30)? How do those yokes compare? How should this affect your joy?
5. Demonic forces remain a reality in this world. They have many schemes by which they aim to weaken, demoralize and sideline the people of God. How have you experienced spiritual warfare? Where is our strength to be found in view of such realities? (Ephesians 6:10-13)
