QUICK REVIEW

The Holy Spirit was poured out upon the church on the Day of Pentecost. He, the Holy Spirit, is the indwelling gift of God to His people. The Book of Acts displays the presence of the Holy Spirit within the church, uniting them as a community and empowering them for ministry. The outpouring of the Spirit came with three great miracles that carry great meaning into our day.

DIGGING DEEPER

1. The Holy Spirit brings power to God's people. Sometimes the Holy Spirit empowers us with great strength and boldness. And He often empowers us when we feel totally weak and fearful. When have you experience moments in either direction?
2. Read Colossians 1:9-14. How is the power of the Holy Spirit pictured in Paul's prayer? What did Paul want God to do in the Colossian Church, and in us by extension?
3. Looking more closely at Colossians 1:11, when have you failed to have endurance and patience with joy? In what circumstances are you tempted to give up and lash out? What does repentance empowered by the Spirit look like?
4. Acts 2 is a fulfillment of Acts 1:6-11. Read the Acts 1 paragraph with a focus on verse 8. What is the significance of each expanding geographic circle? What are the comparable spheres for you?
5. The Holy Spirit gave the church in Acts 2 the ability to speak the works of God in foreign languages. This indicates God's love and desire for all the nations of the earth. He is redeeming all races of people. Is it enough to be "non-racist"? Should the church be demonstrably "anti-racist" too? If so, how so?
