DIGGING DEEPER

1. Some assert that all Christians should expect to speak in tongues even today. Reflect upon I Corinthians 12, the entire chapter. What are the basic central points that Paul is making? Does this chapter expect that all Christians will speak in tongues?
2. What is your perspective on speaking in tongues? Have you developed a position? Do you think they have ceased? That they continue on? What biblical teaching do you give in support of your view?
3. Reflect on Psalm 67. How does this passage relate to Pentecost and the coming global mission of the church? How can you be a part of what Christ is doing globally among the nations of the earth?
4. In Acts 2:7, we read how the Pentecost pilgrims were surprised, not only to hear their languages spoken, but also that they being spoken by simple Galileans. How does this portray the beauty of I Corinthians 1:26-31? What encouragement does this bring to you and to our church?
5. Acts 2:12-13 indicates a varied response to the miracles of Pentecost indicating genuine interest and mockery. What does the Scripture reveal as the reason for this in I Corinthians 2:12-16? How does this inform your approach to talking with people about Jesus?
