DIGGING DEEPER

1. Peter learned a lesson from God, that he must not view any person, or any kind of person (including Roman Gentiles!), as common or unclean. Where do your prejudices lie? What people might you view as defiled, people you should not be close to?
2. Peter was a man raised in an environment of ethnocentrism and racism. God was helping to shed his prior sinful perspectives. In what ways have racism or prejudice been found in the environment you've been raised in?
3. How is Christ exalted in the summary of Peter's sermon found in Acts 10:34-43? Which aspect of the ministry of Christ is most encouraging to you at this moment?
4. "The Gentile Pentecost" of Acts 10:44-48 is parallel to what we read in Acts 2:1-21 and I Corinthians 12:12-31. What practical lessons are impressed upon your heart and life as you read them?
5. One author named Polhill wrote, "It is simply not possible to fully accept someone with whom you are unwilling to share in the intimacy of table fellowship." Do you agree? How does this thought shape your practice this holiday season? Who can you invite to a table?
