QUICK REVIEW

Genesis is the book of origins. In it, God reveals the beginning of the universe, the earth, all life, the human race, man & woman and marriage. All these things were created by God and appraised as very good. But very quickly, evil was found in God's creation. Under the possession of Satan (Revelation 12:9), the serpent led the first human beings into sin. Following his wife's lead, Adam rebelled against God's prohibition, plunging the human race into sin. The LORD God quickly pursued. After drawing their confession, the Lord's declares oracles of judgement. Yet even here victory and mercy are found.

Read Genesis 3:14-24
