DIGGING DEEPER

1. When drinking deeply from the wells of salvation, we come to a great appreciation for the doctrine of propitiation. What is the meaning of this doctrine portrayed in Isaiah 12:1? Would you say this is essential to the meaning of the Gospel? Why?
2. The Apostle John drank from this well of salvation (propitiation) and wrote about it in I John 4:7-12. Reflecting on those verses, what do you learn about the purpose of Christ's coming? And what does the text call from our lives in response?
3. According to Isaiah 12:2, trust and fear cannot dwell together. Isaiah taught about this repeatedly. (See 7:4, 8:12-13, 35:3-4, 41:8-13; 43:1-2; 44:1-8) In what areas do you see Christians continuing to live in fear? Where do you have the same struggle? What is God calling you to do?
4. Isaiah pictures a community of redeemed people admonishing one another toward greater worship and greater outreach. Of the different admonitions of verses 4-6, where can the people of Bethel Grace spur each other on toward greater faithfulness? Where do you need to be spurred on?
