DIGGING DEEPER

1. Many view the doctrine of God's wrath as an "old-fashioned view of God, a throwback to Old Testament times." What do the following passages from the New Testament teach us?

2. In what ways can Christians respond wrongly to the doctrine of God's wrath? What is your tendency?
3. Reflecting on Isaiah 9:8-10, James 4:6 and I Peter 5:5, what kind of pride is God warning us against? How can we guard against such pride taking root in our lives?
4. When sinful desire and practice reign in our lives, human beings begin to consume other human beings (Isaiah 9:19b-21). How does this manifest itself even in the church? Reflecting on Galatians 5:13-25, how can this process be reversed?
5. In what ways are you tempted to support iniquitous decrees (Isaiah 10:1) or even legislate some of your own (Matthew 23:1-4)? How does abiding in Christ destroy either tendency? (See John 15:8-11 & II Timothy 3:14-17)
