QUICK REVIEW

The Gospel of Luke is a detailed, carefully-researched account of the birth, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Luke 9-19 records the Lord’s movement from Galilee to Jerusalem where He will die for our sin. In this passage, Jesus enters into the home a Pharisee for dinner party. He is among men set in their ways. He will challenge them, and us, with the three ways they needed to change their thinking.
