QUICK REVIEW

It's the final week of the life of Christ, and Jesus is teaching and preaching in the temple courts. The Jewish authorities have categorically rejected Jesus and are plotting his death by crucifixion. As they are leaving the temple for the evening, some of the disciples point out the lavish nature of the temple stones and beautifications. Jesus declares the coming destruction of the Jerusalem temple and His glorious 2nd Coming to the earth.

In the section, Jesus goes from prophecy to apocalyptic. He describes the end of the world as we know it and the stunning event of His return to earth. People will be passing out everywhere, fainting with fear. He declares these things to help keep us awake and alert, looking for His coming.
