1. Confronted with the empty grave, the early followers of Jesus were initially bewildered, perplexed and confused. What circumstances have you faced in your life that left you in that condition of being perplexed?

QUICK REVIEW

The Gospel of Luke is a detailed, carefully-researched account of the birth, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The crucifixion is over. The body of Jesus died and was been placed in a garden tomb. On the third day, a number of women who followed Him now encounter the tomb, empty. They are bewildered, and then settled into place by God’s Word through angelic messengers.

3. The angelic pronouncement “He is not here, but has risen” was a declaration of the victory of Christ over the grave. Carefully reflecting on these passages, how does Christ share his victory with us?
