QUICK REVIEW

The Gospel of Luke is a detailed, carefully-researched account of the birth, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The crucifixion is over. The body of Jesus died and was been placed in a garden tomb. On the third day, his tomb was found empty and angels were present proclaiming the resurrection. Even still, many disciples of Jesus remained perplexed and bewildered. Jesus called them “slow of heart to believe.” Jesus appeared to quicken their hearts by revealing the truth of scripture.

3. An accurate view of the Messiah includes both His suffering and exaltation. How is this similar to the New Testament vision of the Christian life?
