### Questions for Application and Fellowship

#### MY STORY

1. How is your eyesight? Good? Bad? Clear? Fuzzy?

#### QUICK REVIEW

The Gospel of Luke is a detailed, carefully-researched account of the birth, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. On the third day, His tomb was found empty and angels were present proclaiming the resurrection. Even still, many disciples of Jesus remained “slow of heart to believe.” Jesus appeared to two of them on the road to Emmaus, but their eyes were kept from recognizing them. Now, having explained a full biblical theology of the Messiah, Jesus opens their eyes to recognize Him.

## DIGGING DEEPER

1. The two disciples insisted that Jesus come in, share a meal, and rest for the night. How is the antithesis of this scene found in what the Lord said to the Church of Laodicea in Revelation 3:14-22, especially verse 20? What would it look like if Christ were the Lord of your home?
2. The Laodicean Church is remembered as “the lukewarm church” which was about to be spit out of His mouth. How does Luke 24:32 contrast with that lukewarm condition? How would Christ describe your condition? Cold, lukewarm or fervent in the faith? Why?
3. Read Romans 12:9-13. Good things happen with hospitality, especially when it is focused on sharing the truth of Christ with both believers and unbelievers. When have you been encouraged by someone’s hospitality? When has hearing about His grace in the lives of others helped you see Him more clearly?
4. Only Christ can open our eyes to the full scope and glory of His messianic power and grace. How does the prayer of Ephesians 1:15-23 reflect this theme of Luke 24? How does this this prayer encourage your walk with Christ today?
