## SERMON REVIEW

### **How can I have gladness in God?**

## DIGGING DEEPER

1. Despite the knowledge of his own struggle with sin (19:12-14), David is able to rejoice and deeply delight in the Lord. How did the natural world spark his worship? How does it prompt you to praise God? What experiences do you have with praising God for all that he has made?
2. We see much of God's nature in the created realm, but in Scripture God is making himself known personally. In fact, in II Timothy 3:14-17, it is the very breath of God. He is speaking to us. What value does the Bible carry in II Timothy 3:14-17? How can you benefit from these things?
3. David spoke of the law of God reviving the soul, along with a number of other effects it brings. This is the efficacy of Scripture and it brought David great delight (19:10). What delightful effects has God's word brought into your life?
4. David speaks of hidden sins. These are sinful attitudes and patterns of behavior a person is not aware of in their own lives. Have you ever had the experience of having such a sin made known to you?
5. Sin desires dominion of our lives. David knew his need for divine intervention if he was to walk in holiness with God. How does God intervene? What has he done? (See Genesis 4:6-7; Psalm 19:13; Psalm 199:133; Romans 6:12-14).
